



## *Canadian Fellowship of B-P Guilds Scholarship*

**The Aims of the Canadian Fellowship of B-P Guilds** are to encourage the members of B-P Guilds within Canada:

- a) *To keep alive the spirit of the Promise and Law.*
- b) *To bring the Scouting spirit into the communities in which they live and work; and*
- c) *To actively support Scouting and Guiding in their communities within Canada and worldwide.*

**The Objectives of the Canadian Fellowship of B-P Guilds** are:

- a) *To establish a liaison and a co-operation between the national organizations of former Scouts and Guides;*
- b) *To establish B-P Guilds in areas where no such B-P Guild exists; and*
- c) *To promote friendship amongst former Scouts and Guides within Canada and throughout the world.*

Scouts Canada Foundation has offered the Canadian Fellowship the opportunity to have a "Named Scholarship" which would be awarded annually to a youth member of Scouting. This scholarship is in the amount of \$1,000.00 and will be awarded alternately (East or West) to a youth within Canada.

The recipient of the "**Canadian Fellowship of B-P Guilds Scholarship**" must be an active member of Scouting and be under the age of 26 on January 1 of the year of the application, and attending a university or college. Scouts Canada Foundation and their volunteers will make the selection based on the applications submitted. The Scholarship will be named the "**Canadian Fellowship of B-P Guilds Scholarship**". The \$1,000.00 is sent directly to the University or College named in the application. Hopefully a B-P Guild will be in the area of the recipients' home town and will be able to present a Certificate and submit pictures of the presentation to Mamook Papah.

We believe that you will agree this is a worthy way to promote and support Scouting here in Canada and will bring the Spirit of Scouting into all our communities.

The ISGF, at their 10th General Assembly in Austria in 1973, and in cooperation with WAGGGS and WOSM, initiated the "J.S. Wilson Fund". This annual grant, known as "J.S. Wilson Scholarship" enables the recipient to attend training courses, seminars and conferences. However, according to the I.S.G.F. Website there has not been an award issued since 1999. It is not our intention to take anything away from the J.S. Wilson Fund, but we believe we found a way to support Scouting and the Scouting Youth right here at home.

The Canadian Fellowship of B-P Guilds will initially launch the Scholarship Fund by donating the first \$1,000.00

So how can you help? Individuals and Guilds are encouraged to forward their donations to the National Treasurer earmarked for the Scholarship Fund. All donations will be published in Mamook Papah

With the support of the Guilds, it is hoped that we surpass the \$1,000 mark each year so that the Scholarship Fund becomes be self-supporting.
